CLEVELAND LAUNCHER SERIES, HIBORE XLI IRONS AND NIBLICK

CLEVELAND have gone big with their latest range of clubs, all the way from the new Launcher driver right through to one of the most curious clubs of the year – the Niblick.

The new Launcher driver has a more traditional look – but this is where the convention ends.

Its face is the largest ever produced by Cleveland while a horseshoe-shaped weight pad on the back of the sole improves both launch and stability. This move to get the centre of gravity as low and deep as possible is also reflected in a super-thin crown, that at

just half a millimetre, is the thinnest possible.

The Launcher fairway woods follow the same principle and have the option to mix and match five lofts with two high-performance Fujikura shafts.

But the range just keeps getting bigger and better as the latest HiBore XLI irons promise even greater distance, increased forgiveness and added consistency.

Aimed at mid-to-high-handicappers they are packed full of technology and are the only hybrid irons that feature a full hollow construction throughout the set.

And so we come to the Niblick, an intriguing combination of a putter, wedge, iron and hybrid that allows you to hit four different types of shots – chips, pitches, approach shots and recoveries.

With a choice of two lofts and armed with Gelback technology and Zip Grooves, should this club deliver what it promises, it could be a revelation from 100 yards in.
